### **DATES FOR YOUR DIARY**

Jo Helme, will share in the morning service of September 8th about her recent summer trip to Nicaragua as part of a team with the Peace and Hope Trust. She will tell of her experiences of working in some of the country's poorest communities and how it has affected her.

Simon Helme will repeat his recent talk on Human Sexuality at Rodborough Tabernacle URC on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> September at 6pm. The talk will cover issues of gender politics, sex and homosexuality.

### **THEME**

Our Main sessions will explore Christian spirituality as expressed through some classic poets. Carole Allen and Simon Helme will look at the Lake Poets Wordsworth and Coleridge, as well as John Donne, George Herbert, Gerard Manley Hopkins and Thomas Traherne, considering some of their 'spiritual works' and reflecting on their cultural and theological contexts, especially the Romantic movement. Simon will also offer morning bible studies on the psalms. Carole will lead morning and evening prayer.

The Director of the Windermere Centre, Lawrence Moore, will also have some input into the programme. He will give two sessions: one on Walter Bruggeman's poetic approach to Biblical interpretation, as expressed in his book, Finally Comes the Poet; secondly the singer songwriter Leonard Cohen, "the Poet of Brokenness and Grace".

Afternoons will be free to enjoy the beauty of the Lake District and the autumn colours. Evenings will be opportunities to relax together.

The retreat will begin at tea time on Monday 14th October 2013 and end after breakfast on Friday 18th, allowing people plenty of travelling time in daylight hours.
