# SHARE A PRAYER AND MAKE OUR CHURCH A POWERHOUSE OF PRAYER

As we enter the time of Lent may we take time to reflect and consider the events up to the good news of the Easter message. This year we have the opportunity to undertake this reflection and consideration through the weekly Christianity Explored course. An opportunity to understand more our faith and the message of Jesus. We pray that the Holy Spirit will act upon those involved in this outreach and may they touch the hearts of those seeking the love of God.

Lent is also a time to give something up. What are you giving up? Chocolate, cakes and biscuits are often traditional things to give up. We pray that those in need may see and know the love of God and see the face of Jesus in those giving up their time and effort in our community. As we enter this time of Lent may we consider giving up not only the treats that our lives provide for us but also put our time and effort into improving God's world.

As Christian's we know how the Easter story ends; throughout Lent we know there is going to be a good ending. We pray that God is with those going through troubled times who do not know what the outcome will be. We pray that they may see light at the end of the tunnel and that we as Christians will provide support through your love and guidance so that the light at the end of the tunnel may be recognised as God's love.

Easter Sunday is seen by many as a more joyous day than Christmas Day. May we take the opportunity of Lent to explore our faith and relationship with God further, put our skills to God's purpose and, like a child deprived of sweets and chocolate for forty days, prepare ourselves for the joy of Christ rising from the dead.

### **Christianity Explored**

Christianity Explored is an informal 6-week course for people who'd like to investigate Christianity, or just brush up on the basics. Looking at Mark's gospel, it explores who Jesus is, why he came, and what it means to follow him.

- Perhaps you went to church when you were younger, or maybe you've never been
- Perhaps you have lots of questions to ask, or perhaps you'd rather just sit and listen
- You might think of yourself as a confused Christian or a convinced atheist, or somewhere in between
- You might have Christian friends and always wondered what made them tick

   and although you think that 'no-one can believe this stuff nowadays' you
   respect your friends enough to want to find out why they believe what they
   believe. You are open to challenge your prejudices!

Christianity Explored is primarily for anyone who wants to investigate Christianity informally with a group of other people. Whether you have previous experience of Church, Christians and the Bible, or none at all, this course is for you. Everyone is welcome - from the most sympathetic Sunday schooler to the convinced atheist. The Christianity Explored Course is being put on by Dursley Tabernacle. Simon Helme, the church minister said:

'There are lots of similarities between a cappuccino and Christianity. There is a lot of froth initially – prejudices and preconceptions. But hopefully, you eventually find it's warm and soothing! These informal relaxed meetings are a great opportunity to see if the Christian faith is your cup of tea?

We have been given the use of the Courtyard Café, (opposite Dursley Tabernacle on Parsonage St, Dursley, GL11 4BW) for six Wednesdays during Lent, starting on February 26th. People can come and buy a drink and something to eat from 7.30pm. At about 8pm there will be an introduction and an opportunity for a discussion starter in small groups, often with a chance to look at the Bible for yourself and ask any questions that you have. There is a short talk of about 15-20 minutes which will focus on the theme for the evening. After that there is open discussion both in small groups and all together.

You can say as much or as little as you like. And don't worry – you'll never be asked to sing, pray or read aloud. You don't need to know anything about the Bible either. And if you miss a week, that's OK too. And you can pull out any time you like, for any reason. The course is free (you will have to pay for your own food and adrink at the café though!). We will provide you with a handbook and a copy of Mark's gospel.

#### Tab FM...can you help?

At Elders' in February there was some discussion about the problems which arise when furniture needs to be moved around the premises. The re-ordering of the sanctuary into a multi-function space has been a huge blessing in terms of the flexibility of our worship space but this, combined with the breakdown of the lift, has created different challenges for Team Tab.

We are now appealing for able-bodied folk, regardless of age or gender, who feel able to move chairs and tables around the building to volunteer themselves for a "Furniture Movers" list which event organisers can draw upon when organising events. Jobs might include resetting the layout in the sanctuary (training about using the chair-trolley to reduce lifting can be given), or carrying the lighter chairs and tables up or down stairs.

With a sufficiently broad list of volunteers, no-one will need to feel put upon and event organisers will have a range of options for volunteers when planning Tab activities.
