<u>Re-Reading Romans: a series of Bible studies (22 Oct, 5th, 19 November) led By Simon</u> <u>Helme</u>

After my last sabbatical, ten years ago, I came back and did a series of bible studies on Paul's letter to the Romans. Protestants, in particular, have seen Romans as the most important of Paul's letter and believe it gives a summary of the Gospel. After returning from my recent sabbatical I would like to offer the opportunity to re-read Romans. Part of my sabbatical was spent reflecting on the historical foundations of our faith and the Jewishness of Jesus and Paul and the other writers of the New Testament and catching up with recent biblical scholarship. The 'new perspective' on Paul radically changes how we read his letters. I would like to share some of those insights, based on the work of the respected British scholar and former bishop of Durham, Tom Wright.

We will look again at the issues of sin, the wrath of God, righteousness and justification, atonement and reconciliation (Thursday 22nd October); the Christian hope, life after death, resurrection and new creation (Thursday November 5th); Christianity and its relationship to Judaism and how that affects current Christian attitudes towards the State of Israel and the End Times (November 19th).

CHRISTIAN AID

Many thanks for your kind donation of £500.00 on 1ST October 2015 towards the work of Christian Aid. Your response to our emergency appeal is greatly appreciated. Thank you for the Gift Aid Declarations that you sent along with the cheques. The GADs will be processed separately to enable us to reclaim the Gift Aid. We appreciate the support of your members - please do pass on our thanks and best wishes to them.

The images of desperate refugees crossing the Mediterranean in unstable boats, or packed illegally into lorries, or protesting' We are human beings too' in the port of Calais, are a distressing reminder of the shocking refugee crisis that led to the founding of Christian Aid in 1945. Your support is enabling us, through-the Act Alliance, to support churches and other agencies in Europe as well as our partners in the Middle East.

In Greece, the International Orthodox Christian Charities are providing food and non-food items, improving conditions at reception centres, and undertaking water, sanitation and hygiene activities on the islands of Chios, Samos, and Kos. Between August 1-24, 300 refugees arrived on Chios each day; 500 refugees arrived on Samos each day and 1,300 refugees arrived on Lesvos each day. Meanwhile in Hungary, Hungarian Interchurch Aid is providing refugees on the border with non-food items, and has helped more than 5,500 people.

We are continuing to support our partners in Syria and Iraq, as well as neighbouring countries, in their work with refugees there. Our partners are providing essential humanitarian supplies such as food, fuel for cooking," hygiene and sanitation kits, water containers and cash assistance, as well as psychological support for those who are suffering because of the conflict. So far, we have reached tens of thousands, of people within Syria and in neighbouring Lebanon and Iraq with a combination of food, essentials like blankets to keep warm, cooking sets, health and hygiene kits, and psychosocial support. Your support is enabling our partners in Lebanon and lark, and within Syria itself, to continue to respond to the desperate humanitarian needs of some of the most vulnerable displaced communities. Once again, thank you so much for your continued support of our work with and for the poorest communities on earth. With your continued help, we can make a difference'

<u>Summer Mission Trip to Nicaragua 2016</u> Simon Helme will be chaplain to the Peace and Hope's summer team to Nicaragua in 2016. There is an invitation to anyone to join the team for this exciting chance to make a difference in one of the poorest parts of the world.

Since the Trust began work in Nicaragua more than 20 years ago, well over 3,000 volunteers from the UK and around the world have experienced lifechanging visits to the country as members of one of their Teams. Team members are drawn from every age group and from all stratas of society, united by a common desire to serve those less fortunate than themselves. The Trust sends teams of volunteers several times a year, typically for a 2 or 3 week visit. Activities are varied, suiting all ages and abilities, and range from work on the building site to children's parties, craft making, supporting local churches and healthcare.
