# Dursley Tabernacle's Church Family Weekend in Sheldon, Dartmoor

#### **BOOKING INFORMATION**

Back by popular request, next June we are planning to return to the Sheldon Centre for our church family weekend. Those who went on either of our last two Sheldon weekends will tell you there is something for everyone. The centre has lovely grounds to walk in and many quiet places, but it's also great for children with lots of adventures and games to be had. It's close to the beach and also to the attractions of Dartmoor. Tour the premises by looking at their website <a href="www.sheldon.uk.com">www.sheldon.uk.com</a> or ask around the congregation to hear stories of our time there in past years.

The weekend will be run by us, including the catering, to keep costs as low as possible. Rod and Emma Irvine have agreed to manage the catering again as we did last year, rather than trying to set up a complex team of volunteers, and we are grateful to them for this. Due to a slight increase in centre costs, the charge this year will be £100 per adult, with no charge for children under 18 who are still in education. This will assume full occupancy of the centre as in previous years; obviously, in the unlikely event that we don't have enough adult members, we may have to ask for a voluntary offering to cover costs for young people. Our programme will be similar to previous years; we will all eat together and meet together, but we are responding to feedback and intend to plan in a little more flexibility and free time for spontaneous things to happen! As before, transport will be managed with lift sharing and goodwill donations between friends.

Accommodation is mainly in twin bedrooms, some of which can be made into family rooms with additional mattresses for children, and two ground floor rooms have extra children's beds on an upstairs deck. There are just two single rooms and only three ground floor rooms. If you have mobility problems and would like to be in one of the ground floor rooms, please indicate when booking. There are 34 beds with 14 extra mattresses for children and a couple of cots available.

Places are offered on a first-come first-served basis, so book early to be sure of a space on the weekend. If places are not filled by January we will invite other local churches to join us.

# SYNOD TRIP TO IONA – Sept 2014

This is to let you and your church(es) know that once more it is possible to be part of a group going to spend a week on lona and we are eager to have friends old and new join us. A small group of us based at Holyhead Road URC is organising a week's stay with the lona community at the Abbey – this will be from Saturday 13 September to Friday 19 September 2014. For our last trip we were joined by friends from all over Coventry and Warwickshire and from further afield in the West Midlands and we are hoping to have a similar ecumenical experience, this time round.

Assuming (and it is a fairly safe bet) that we attract forty-two takers in total, our party will be taking over the whole of the Abbey accommodation. Nevertheless this week will be organised in the usual community pattern – those who go to the Abbey will take part in its worship life and will participate in mealtime duties and other housework through the week, with plenty of free time and opportunities to see the island, whether or not as part of organised trips. We ourselves will be organising a short programme of study and discussion on three of the mornings, on topics still to be determined. On our last trip we looked at aspects of the Book of Psalms, and finished by corporately composing a new Psalm in response to our discussions and our week's experience.

The cost of the week at the Abbey is approximately £340, which does not include transport to and from the island. It is intended that a coach will be arranged to leave Coventry on the evening of 12 September. There will be pickups arranged at one or two other locations according to demand. The cost of travel will be calculated nearer the time on the basis of how many participate. Those organising their own transport to lona (via ferries to Mull and lona itself) are equally welcome. Note that in 2011 the cost of coach and all ferry and Mull bus travel was approximately £110 return.
