#### Sheldon, Dartmoor

#### <u> THEME – Who Do You Say I am?</u>

We will explore the 'I am' sayings of Jesus in John's gospel (e.g. I am the Bread of Life, the Good Shepherd, the Vine, the Resurrection and the life etc.). We will hopefully gain more understanding of the Fourth Gospel and John's portrayal of Jesus. The weekend will offer us the chance to refresh our vision of who is Jesus and what he means to us. There will be a creative mixture of learning and participation, laughter and reflection.

#### **BOOKING INFORMATION**

Those who went last year will tell you there is something for everyone. The centre has lovely grounds to walk in and many quiet places, but it's also great for children with lots of adventures and games to be had. It's close to the beach and also to the attractions of Dartmoor. Tour the premises by looking at their website <u>www.sheldon.uk.com</u> or ask around the congregation to hear stories of our time there last summer. The pictures are now certified.

The weekend will be run by us, including the catering, to keep costs as low as possible. Costs this year are £90 per adult, with no charge for children under 18 who are still in education. Accommodation is mainly in twin bedrooms, some of which can have additional mattresses for children and two with extra children's beds on an upstairs deck. There are just a couple of single rooms\* and a couple of ground floor rooms. There are 38 beds available with 8 extra mattresses for children. We will all eat together and meet together. The programme is being planned by a team of elders and will include a balance between free time and planned sessions for all ages. We intend to share the load of delivering the weekend by creating teams of people with certain responsibilities. It's a good way to get to know someone!

#### Dursley Tabernacle's Retreat Holiday

#### 14th to 18th October 2013

#### Windermere, Cumbria.

#### <u>THEME</u>

Our Main sessions will explore Christian spirituality as expressed through some classic poets. Carole Allen and Simon Helme will look at the Lake Poets Wordsworth and Coleridge, as well as John Donne, George Herbert, Gerard Manley Hopkins and Thomas Traherne, considering some of their 'spiritual works' and reflecting on their cultural and theological contexts, especially the Romantic movement. Simon will also offer morning bible studies on the psalms. Carole will lead morning and evening prayer.

The Director of the Windermere Centre, Lawrence Moore, will also have some input into the programme. He will give tow sessions: one on Walter Bruggeman's poetic approach to Biblical interpretation, as expressed in his book, Finally Comes the Poet; secondly the singer songwriter Leonard Cohen, "the Poet of Brokenness and Grace".

Afternoons will be free to enjoy the beauty of the Lake District and the autumn colours. Evenings will be opportunities to relax together.

#### **BOOKING INFORMATION**

This year, by popular request, we are offering another midweek retreat holiday to allow the adult members of our congregation a time for fellowship and reflection together. We have booked the Windermere Centre which is the United Reformed Church's residential training centre located, unsurprisingly, not far from the shore of Windermere in our beautiful Lake District. The centre is close to the local railway station or can be reached from Dursley by car in about four hours, depending on traffic. The retreat will begin at tea time on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> October 2013 and end after breakfast on Friday 18<sup>th</sup>, allowing people plenty of travelling time in daylight hours. Full board accommodation is to be provided at a cost of £234 per person, although a slight discount of £4 per night is available for those prepared to share a room. Accommodation for up to 30 people is available in 21 en-suite rooms, with 12 single rooms (2 of which are fully equipped for wheelchair users) 5 twin rooms, 1 double room and 3 triple rooms<sup>\*</sup>. The programme is to be planned by a team of elders and will include a balance between free time and planned sessions.

Find out more at <u>info@strouddistrictkidsstuff.org.uk</u> clothes, furniture, and toiletries are given and stored at the warehouses.


