## **Soup Lunches**

Soup lunches will take place at the Methodist church in Christian Aid week from Tuesday through till Saturday. Dursley Tab are hosting the lunches on Thursday. Please can you help on the day, provide soup or bread or just come along and enjoy the lunch and fellowship.

#### Christian Aid Door to Door Collection

The door to door collection is a huge money raiser for Christian Aid, people contribute to this who would not normally give and many give generously. The more volunteers we have the easier is the task. I would love to be able to cover each road with 2 people. Most of our patch is central to Dursley, although we do have a few areas in Cam. Please can you help? If you have done this in past years I will assume you will continue unless you let me know otherwise.

### Save'n'borrow Credit Union

The Save'n'borrow Credit Union, formerly known as Stroud Valleys Credit Union, now has a weekly collection point at the **Parish Council office in Cam on Wednesday mornings (10 – 11.30am)** as well as being at the **Treetops Children Centre on Friday afternoons between 2.30 and 4pm**.

The Credit Union is an ethical profit-sharing co-operative which is run by volunteers who are all members. We are regulated in the same way as banks so your money is safe with us! We provide a friendly, personal banking service; members are encouraged to save regularly, making payments either by standing order or by cash or cheque at one of our collection points. Some members save for something in particular like holidays, school uniform or Christmas; others build up a nest egg for an emergency like a broken washing machine! As it usually takes up to a week to withdraw money, saving with us also means that you're not tempted to use your savings for an instant or impulse buy; for many members this helps them save and budget properly. We also offer junior savings accounts for children under the age of 16 and these usually attract a higher dividend.

Members can take out low interest loans based on their savings. For example, if you save £100 you can apply for a Standard Loan of £200 and you will only repay £213. If you don't have sufficient savings to borrow against we also offer other types of loans which also have very competitive rates of interest.

Anyone who lives in the Stroud District or Tetbury areas is welcome to join as a member – there is a simple application process. We also need volunteers to help run the Cam and Dursley (and other) collection points and/or other parts of the Credit Union; we are a friendly and welcoming group and full training is given.
