When this school closed in 1887, a trust in the name of Joseph Twemlow continued to support the education of Non-conformist young people in the area. Since 1947, this has been through donating small grants to students in higher education.

Applications are now invited from students in, or about to enter, higher education, for grants for the 20/12/13 academic year. Applicants must be from Nonconformist families and resident in the parishes of Dursley, Cam or Uley.
