"Do not worry about anything, but in all your prayers ask God for what you need, always asking him with a thankful heart. And God's peace, which is far beyond understanding, will keep your hearts and minds safe in union with Christ Jesus". (Philippians Ch. 4 verses 6 & 7. NIV)

When we pray, whether together in the fellowship of the church or alone in the inner sanctuary of our hearts, we are 'tuning-in' to the heart of God, whose nature is pure love and whose power is unimaginable.
