Jubilee Street Party for the whole of Dursley – Sunday June 3rd 12.30 – 2pm Dursley Town Hall/Parsonage Street

Dursley Town Centre Churches are organising a street party to enable the whole community to celebrate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. The Big Lunch, part of a national initiative by the Eden Project and Hope Together, will take place on Sunday 3rd June 12.30pm-2pm running

down Parsonage Street in the pedestrianised centre of Dursley, from the Town Hall to the Kina's Head.

The churches will set up tables in a long line down Parsonage Street and anyone is invited to come and sit at them and share food. There will be music, quizzes and activities, but the main emphasis is on the community coming together to share a Big Lunch: a traditional street party to mark the Queen's Diamond Jubilee.

Although the event is organised by the churches, apart from saying grace, there will not be any religious content. This is designed to be a community event to bring everyone together. There is no charge – people are just asked to bring and share food if they are able. Hot drinks will be available.

Revd Simon Helme, minister of Dursley Tabernacle says: 'National celebrations and the opportunity for a community street party only come around once in a generation. We wanted to offer the people of Dursley the chance to come together and share lunch and make memories that will be part of the family photo album for years to come.'

Revd Janet Bromley, Rector of St James the Great, says: 'we hope that young and old will come and join our community celebrations for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. There will be plenty of food so please come even if you can't bring anything. The most important thing is getting together and enjoying each other's company.'

Revd John Emmett, Minister of Dursley Methodist Church says: 'Eating together is an important way of binding communities together especially at time of celebrations: birthdays, anniversaries Christmas etc. Whether it is offering the food we prepare in our homes or sharing it outside, it is a great way to enjoy each others' company and to share our enthusiasm. #### SYNOD MINISTRY AND MISSION CONTRIBUTION

The May Church Meeting agreed to propose to Synod increasing our MoM contribution up to the suggested figure, but staged over a three year period.

To cover this would require an increase in the required levels of members' donations and general church income.

The full costs associated with running this church can be found in the Annual Financial Statement, which is available on request and should soon be available on our web site.

The contribution that this pastorate makes to the URC MoM is currently £35,640 per year. This pays for our ministers' stipend and all its associated costs, as well as central URC costs. Based on a formula of £30,240 + £84.73 per member, Synod calculate that this year we should be paying £42,822, which is £7,182 more than we are doing.

It was suggested at the May Church Meeting that it might be useful to communicate to the membership what this MoM figure works out as per member.

The increased MoM contribution would work out as £291 per member per year. It should be remembered that this is by no means the full picture; the church has many other costs to cover and several other sources of income in addition to members' donations. Clearly some members can afford to contribute more than others and non-members also contribute.

#### Memorial in the Garden of Rest

At the recent church meeting Hazel Harris explained her idea about having a memorial built in the garden of rest for people whose ashes are there. She has obtained a quotation for

£1,250 + VAT for the base stone and then people could pay for their own memorial plaques rather than just writing names in the memorial book as we do at the moment. A further suggestion was made, that such plaques could be placed on a sculpture which may not have the same costs.



An opinion was expressed that the remembrance book was sufficient and that a memorial of this type would spoil the garden. A further concern was expressed that the garden is used for church family picnics and games for our young people, and that there might be a risk that this step would make people feel such use was disrespectful.

It was noted that, although there is no money in the budget for this, 'In Memoria' reserve money might be available.

It was agreed that the issue should be left for further discussion and that financial pledges should be offered to the treasurer by anyone interested in supporting the venture before the church meeting.

Machine Gun Preacher has just recently been in the cinemas. It stars Gerard Butler. It tells the inspirational true story of Sam Childers, a former drug dealing criminal who becomes a

Christian and finds an unexpected calling as the saviour of hundreds of kidnapped and orphaned children in war torn Sudan. The film contains strong language and scenes of a religious nature! Please don't bring any firearms.

The hire of the cinema is £100 (most of the proceeds go to charity - but you also get an ice cream thrown into the deal). The Tab Men's Group is open to any men, whether or not they attend the Tab - come along for a night out!

**Petition against pornography on the internet –** Premier Radio are asking people to sign a petition enforcing internet service providers to prevent children from having access to pornography on the internet without adult permission. Details and the petition to sign, are in the church vestibule.

Please pray for the following items in the coming month.

- 1. Please pray that negotiations re the new parsonage and the plans for the use of the old parsonage, as a youth centre, may go smoothly. May the Lord be with the working party involved as they move ahead with the forward planning.
- 2. Thank the Lord for all the work that has been done on the refurbishment of the community rooms Pray for the smooth handover for organisations using the rooms and a growth in their future use by our local community.
- 3. Give thanks that rain has eased drought conditions affecting several regions in Ethiopia and Kenya, rejuvenating water sources and enabling some displaced families to return home. However, International Aid Services are helping thousands of people affected by Somalia's enduring drought. Many have fled to displacement camps where water is distributed, also hygiene kits and cooking equipment, child friendly spaces are being set up where youngsters can socialise and play in safety. More than 2.3 million Somalis (1/3 of the population) are in need of food aid. Please pray for a co-ordinated international response to the growing hunger crisis in the western regions of Africa.

#### **Electronic Digital Piano**

David Pritchard spoke about his remit to investigate the costs of an Electronic Digital Piano. Members of the music group who play the existing keyboard are aware of its limitations and feel that an electronic piano would enhance the music group provision but also offer opportunities for concerts and other events.

Some voices spoke against the idea – it was felt that the ordinary piano was adequate and that the church does not have money for such a purchase at this time. Concerns were voiced that the existing piano was given by a family who still live in the area and that it should not be removed. One person suggested that the life of an electronic piano might be

#### limited.

It was noted that there was no suggestion to replace the existing piano – it would be the keyboard which would be replaced. It was explained that the keyboard was limited in the sound that it produces and has a limited number of keys. Some voiced the benefits of an electronic piano and a representative of the entertainments committee felt it might extend opportunities for lettings.

This was clearly a controversial topic and time for reflection will be required. Like the proposal for the memorial wall in the garden of rest, there is no budget for this item so any development would be subject to financial pledges being offered. Further discussion is to be brought to the next church meeting.

**Be part of a miracle- FOODBANK 5K FEAST** With Dursley, Stonehouse and Stroud now open we are looking to expand both the public awareness of our project and raise finance to support the running costs of this expansion. To this end, the Marah Trust and the Stroud District Foodbank want to ask for your support in an event we are running. We putting on the 5k Feast, an event that will see 5000 people take part in a series of meals organised by local community groups, businesses and individuals. We want you to join in with us and encourage others to get involved in your community.

Between the 16th July and 22nd July we are asking people to organise a Feast- it could be a meal, a coffee morning or just a few nibbles- and invite their friends and neighbours to share with them and give a donation to the work of the Foodbank and Marah. We think it could be a great opportunity everyone involved with the Foodbank project to make sure that everyone in our District knows we are ending food poverty and that every single person has a role to play in making sure people do not go hungry.

We will be providing all the resources: invitations, party ideas, posters etc but we need you to share the idea with your friends and colleagues, maybe host a party yourself and generally gossip about the idea. The rest is left up to your imagination!

Thank you so much for your support. The foodbank is nothing without those that commit their time and effort to make it work. Since we opened we have now fed over 450 people and that is only because people like you have helped us and offered your support. I hope you will join us in this 5k Feast and that together we can take yet another step towards ending food poverty in our District.
