### Parsonage Project Appeal Pentecost 2013 May 18th-19th

On 17<sup>th</sup> March 2013 our church meeting voted unanimously to submit plans for the re-development of our premises. The project will have several phases and no single phase will begin until the funding for it is in place. With prayer, we must now step out in faith to seek whether the funds to turn our vision into reality are available.

What are we planning? As the catalyst for this development comes from the vacancy of the old Parsonage, we are calling the project "The Parsonage Project" although the things that need to be addressed extend beyond the development of the Parsonage. The phases of the project will inevitably involve overlap, but the work ahead of us can be roughly divided into four different sections:

- · Creation of Youth Centre facility.
- · Re-development of the upstairs kitchen, upper hall and rooms at

the rear of the premises.

- Re-development of the upper floors of the old Parsonage.
- · Improvement of access in various parts of the building.

### How much will this cost Dursley Tabernacle URC?

The main funding for the Youth Centre installation is to come from the Town Council, but we will need to provide an estimated  $\pounds 16,000$  for the cross-over aspects of this first phase. The remainder of the Parsonage Project has not been fully costed yet, but a rough estimate suggests somewhere in the region of  $\pounds 150,000 - \pounds 200,000$ .

### Pentecost Appeal 18-19th May

Launched at the Church Meeting on April 29<sup>th</sup>, all church members will receive a booklet giving details of how we intend to launch our appeal on the Pentecost weekend and how church members can be involved and support our next development either in prayer, time or financial giving.

This Pentecost we are asking church members to prayerfully consider whether they can give a special gift, over and above what they already give to the church, to launch our appeal. This is the first time since 2008/09 that we have made a direct appeal for extra funds.

Gifts can be given in sealed envelopes that will be available after April 29<sup>th</sup>. Simon, our minister will be in the church reception room on Saturday morning May 18<sup>th</sup> 9.30-11.30am to talk with people about the project/appeal and receive gift envelopes. Alternatively, Gift envelopes can be received in the offertory on Sunday morning 19<sup>th</sup> May. Please consider if you are able to help in this way.

### <u>'Something to sell?</u> Why not advertise it on Tab-bay! and raise money for our <u>Redevelopment Fund.</u>

Look out for the little notice board where you can advertise something you might want to sell - indicating the price - and donate all (or a proportion of) the money raised to the Fund. Couldn't be simpler - let's give it a try!'
