HELPER ROLE AT OPEN DOOR Open Door Club is for adults with learning disabilities. We meet every Tuesday evening at the Tabernacle from 7.30-9pm. As well as providing a social club for the members we aim to give their parents and carers a break. We are looking for people to help at club itself or to drive members to and from club. As a helper at club you could be asked to play cards, darts or table tennis with members; organise table top games; join in art and craft sessions; support members at a range of singing and dancing events; help with the tuck shop; or just sit and chat. We also go to shows occasionally and have an annual day out. You would be invited to come along to these events. Helpers are not expected to come to club every week but are welcome and we would appreciate any time that you can spare. IGNITE is a two day conference at Dursley Tabernacle URC Friday 17th – Saturday 18th October 2014 exploring the person and work of the Holy Spirit from a Reformed Church Perspective.

The conference will be led by Revd Paul Stokes, a URC Minister currently serving at Plymstock United Church, and a national director of the Dunamis Project (visit www.dunamis.org.uk)

On Friday 17th October 7.30 – 9.15pm the evening session will look at *Introducing the Spirit*: looking at experiences of the Holy Spirit at work, our worldviews and how they affect our views; and who not what the Spirit as the third person of the Trinity is.

On Saturday 18th October the first morning sessions 10am to 11.15am will focus on *Understanding the Spirit*: Great Expectations – our need and Jesus' promise of the Holy Spirit; Antiquity – the Holy Spirit in the Old Testament; Epiphany – the Holy Spirit in the Old Testament. The second morning sessions 11.30am to 12.45pm will be about *Encountering the Spirit*: Pentecost – the Spirit's work in the early church; Encompassing – what the Holy Spirit does in our lives; Clothed and Inhabited – biblical distinctions about the Spirit's activity.

After a lunch break the final afternoon sessions 1.55 – 4pm will explore Co-operating with the Spirit: Growing in the Spirit's power; Welcoming the Spirit's gifts.

Churches Together Christian Aid Community Partnership – Burkina Faso

At the Churches Together Forum last month we agreed as Churches in Cam and Dursley to support a Christian Aid Community Partnership scheme in Burkina Faso for the next few years as the Convenors Charity. We have to raise a minimum of £5,000 and the EU will match that fivefold. Below are brief details about the partnership:

As each year passes, families in Burkina Faso continue to suffer from the devastating effects of drought. Many struggle to grow food and earn an income, and experience hunger on a daily basis. But hope is emerging. In November last year, our partner ODE began work that will help thousands of people lift themselves out of poverty and transform their lives by turning arid land into fruitful harvests. The project you're supporting will help communities in 45 villages in northern Burkina Faso. It will support the poorest and most vulnerable families, who continue to struggle following the devastating drought in 2012. The project's ambitions are rooted in the needs of the community, making them not only achievable but sustainable. By increasing the quality and quantity of harvests families will be able to achieve security for the future. Not only will they be able to produce enough to eat, but they can then sell on the remainder to pay for vital schooling, healthcare and a variety of foods, improving nutrition for her whole family.
