# A day with Russ Parker - "Where Eagles Dare: growing Jesus' Healing Ministry"

Rev Dr Russ Parker has been Director of Acorn Christian Healing Foundation since 1995, which exists to resource and educate the church in the Christian Healing Ministry. Russ is the author of a number of books which include: "Healing Dreams", "Healing Death's Wounds"; "Free to Fail", "Forgiveness is Healing", and "The Wild Spirit" and "Dream Stories" "Healing Wounded History," "Healing Wounded History

Russ travels extensively around the UK and abroad, lecturing and teaching in issues connected with the Christian Healing and Healthcare, Reconciliation and Church Transformation.

Russ was a Baptist Pastor from 1972–77, ordained in the Church of England in 1981.He is also a co-founder of the Community of Aidan and Hilda whose mother house is situated on the holy island of Lindisfarne.

He is a founder member of the Fellowship of Christ the Healer (UK and USA) which exists to resource leaders of residential healing and healthcare initiatives.

He is co-founder of Wholecare an initiative to support and resource Christian healthcare professionals within the NHS. He has a post graduate degree in Phenomenology and Theology from Nottingham University in which his thesis was entitled Dreams as a Religious Phenomenon. Russ was awarded a Doctor of Divinity from Columbia Evangelical Seminary in the United States in recognition of his outstanding contribution to Christian ministry and for his many writings and his teaching abilities. In particular it was given for the standard of scholarship in his latest book "Healing Wounded History" which is about reconciling peoples and healing places.
